Project Description & Goal



The University of Massachusetts Medical School (UMass) SNAP Employment & Training (E&T) Provider Reimbursement Project is a collaboration with the Department of Transitional Assistance (DTA) to expand the scope of E&T providers that can help SNAP clients gain skills, training, or experience to improve their employment opportunities.

Our Goal is to expand SNAP recipient access to E&T services in the Commonwealth and enable Community Partners providing approved SNAP E&T services to access federal funds* to continue and supplement existing activities.

* Current reimbursement rate is up to 50% of allowable E&T expenditures.

Why Participate?

- Low-income households, including Able-Bodied Adults Without Dependents (ABAWDs) subject to work requirements, may benefit from the E&T services you provide.
- These services may qualify for federal funds.

What Services Qualify?

- Job search
- Job search training
- Education (HiSET, ESL)
- Skills training

Other Qualifications

Service activities must be funded through allowable sources. These include:

- Private grants
- Individual donations
- Federal community development block grants

Eligibility

- Providers must be enrolled in the SNAP Provider Reimbursement Project.

- UMass will conduct an interview with you to evaluate your qualifications, identify required documents you will need to enroll, and guide you through the enrollment process.
